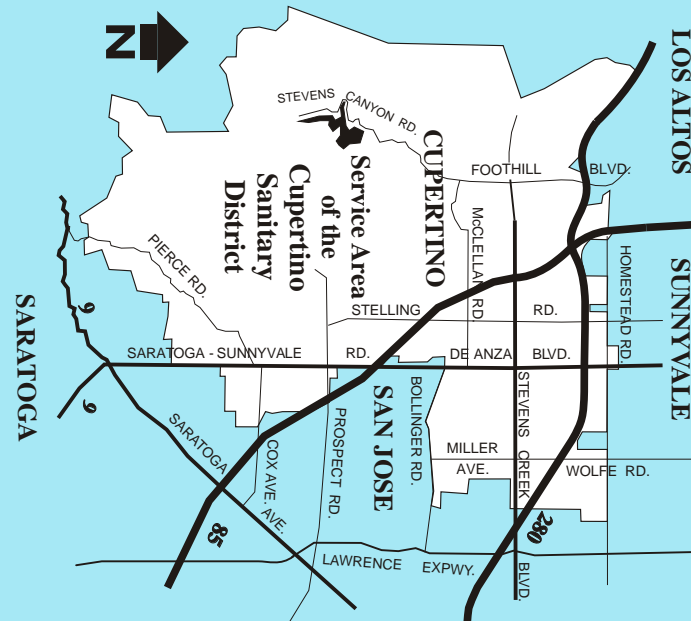
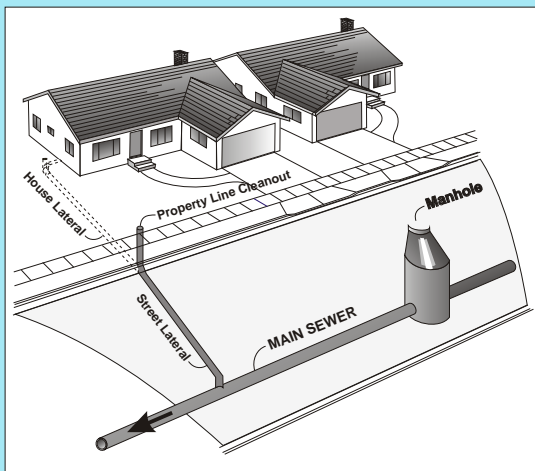
SAVE FOR EMERGENCIES

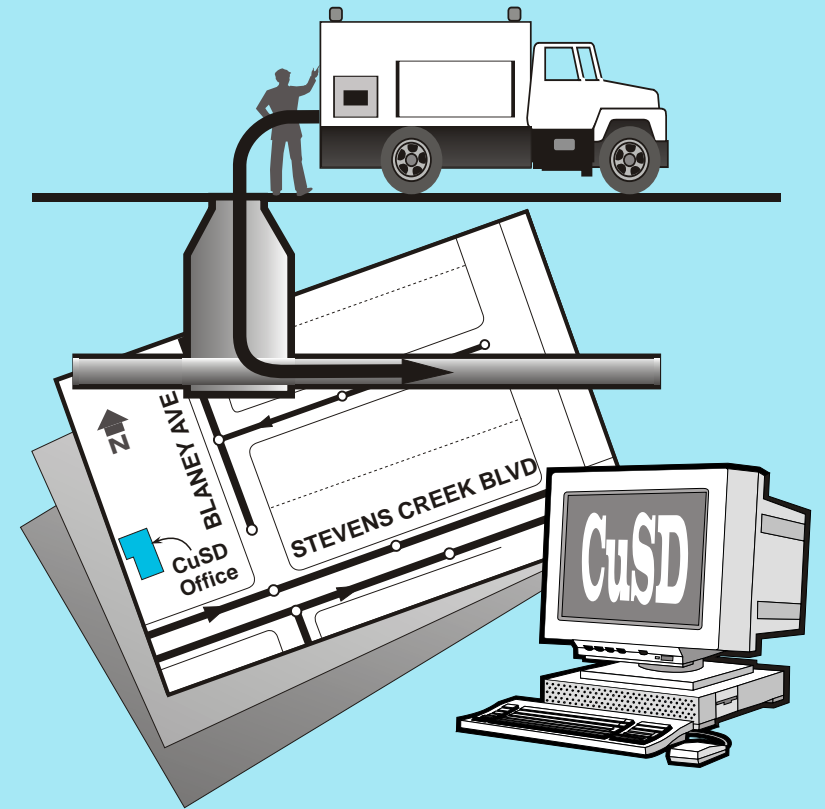

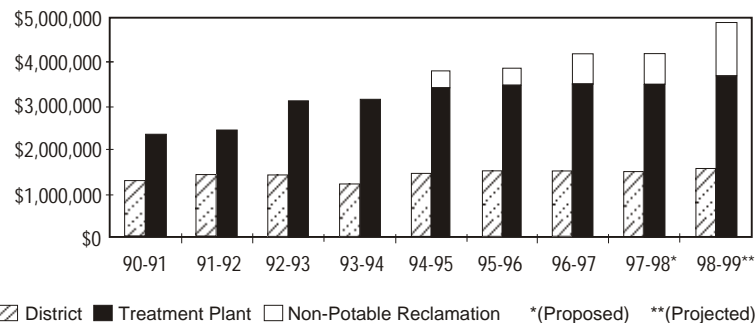

We are pleased to present this Annual Report for our 44th year of service to this community. We are a Special District with an independently elected five member Board of Directors, who are directly responsible to you, the citizens within this District, to provide a safe, effective and economical sewerage system.

The Cupertino Sanitary District provides service to approximately 52,000 persons (21,496 homes and businesses) within the City of Cupertino and portions of the Cities of Saratoga, Los Altos and surrounding unincorporated areas.

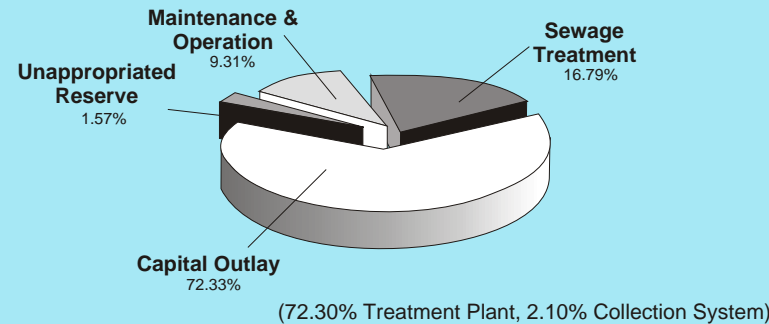
The District's single family sewer service charge for Fiscal Year 1998-1999 was not increased, while Operations and Maintenance costs within the District relative to the collection system actually decreased somewhat. Service charges were increased in 1995 because of the continually increasing costs associated with the treatment of the sewage at the San Jose/Santa Clara Water Pollution Control Plant. These increased costs are a result of *very stringent environmental regulations* placed on the plant by the Regional Water Quality Control Board. The largest of these costs is the implementation of the non-potable water reclamation project in an effort to reclaim up to 60 million gallons per day, of wastewater that would otherwise be discharged to the South Bay. Approximately 75 percent of the District's sewer service charges are paid directly to the plant for costs associated with sewage treatment and the South Bay Water Recycling project. Although future increases may be necessary to fund the South Bay Action Plan, no increase was necessary at this time.

Comparison of District & Treatment Plant Costs



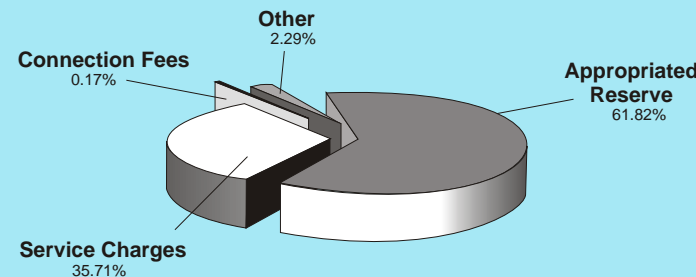
