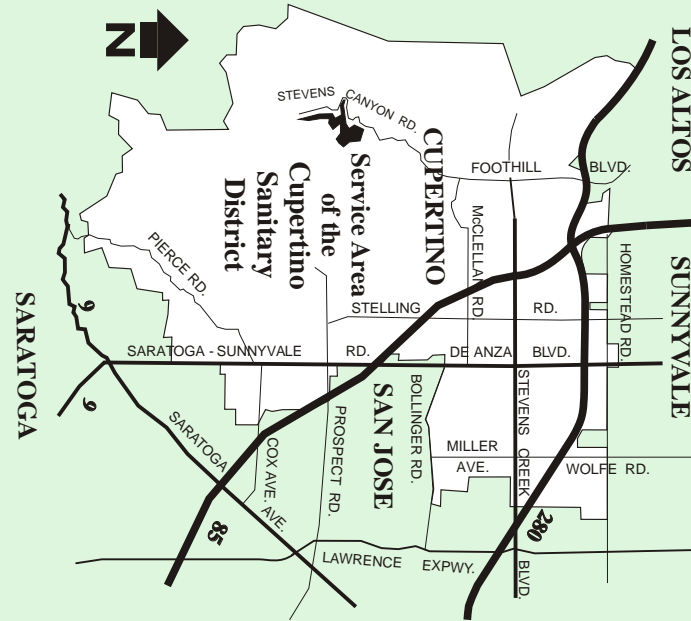

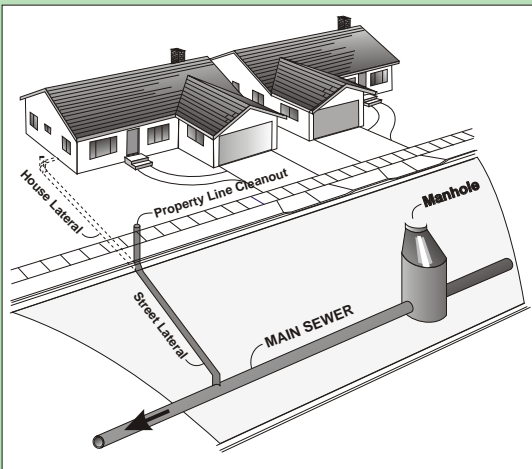

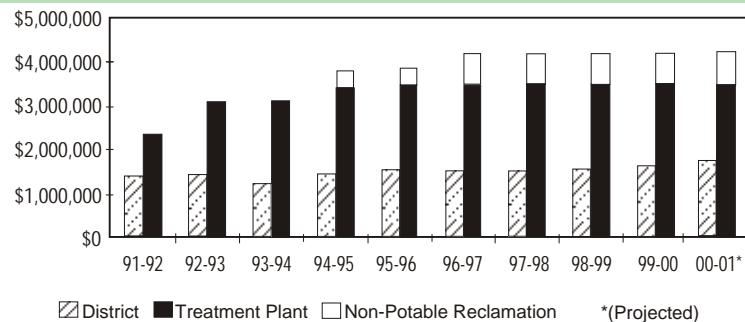
We are pleased to present the 46th Annual Report of the Cupertino Sanitary District. The District serves the City of Cupertino and portions of the Cities of Saratoga and Los Altos, and un-incorporated Santa Clara County within its boundaries. This encompasses an area of 15 square miles with 52,000 people and 22,000 homes. In addition, we service all commercial and industrial developments located within the District.

The District owns and manages over 1 million lineal feet of sewer lines and 14 pump stations, together with all the required support equipment necessary to make the system operate on a continual basis, 24 hours a day. In today's dollars the cost to replace all of the system's facilities would exceed \$150,000,000.

To comply with governmental regulatory requirements, and to protect the District's investment, the Board of Directors inaugurated last year an ongoing program for video inspection of all of the main sewer lines within the District. Each year we will clean and video inspect 150,000 lineal feet of lines in order to locate and record any section of lines which may become a problem in the future. The results of the inspections are recorded on a computer based Geographic Information System (GIS), which will be accessible through the Internet. With this approach, maintenance on current problem areas is being completed now, thereby preventing further deterioration of those lines. Upon completion of the project we will be able to identify the source of any problems within the District's sewer line system and make necessary repairs as well as schedule regular maintenance to other sections of lines in the future, thereby greatly extending the useful life of all of our lines.

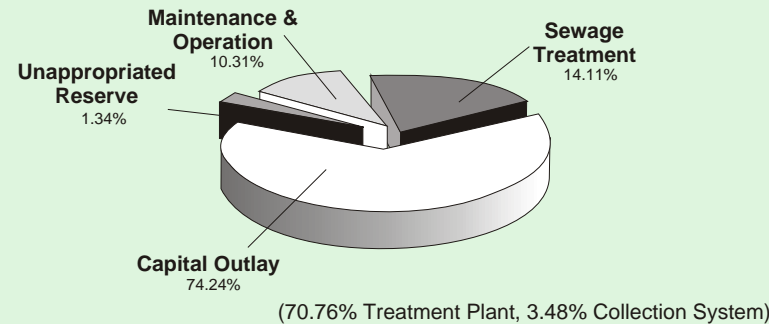
Approximately 70 percent of the District's sewer service charges are paid directly to the San Jose/Santa Clara Water Pollution Control Plant for costs associated with sewage treatment and the South Bay Water Recycling project. Although no increase in service costs is necessary at this time, as the system ages, small regular step increases will be needed to develop reserves to pay for repairs and replacement of old pipe and equipment and for future increases in treatment costs.

Comparison of District & Treatment Plant Costs



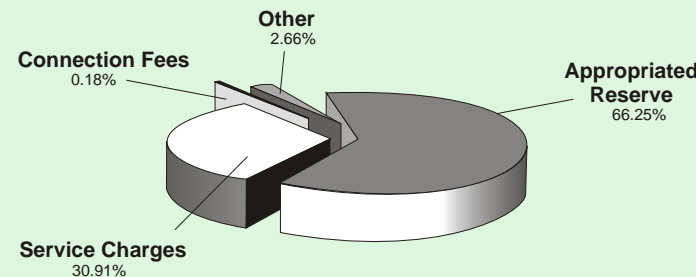
